An online grants management and data collection system that is used by 20 First 5 County Commissions.

- Annual budget: \$96,896
- System modules include: Fiscal, Performance, Client Data, Reports, Procurement, etc.
- F5SMC implemented Persimmony for grants management and reporting during the FY 16-17 Mid-Year reporting cycle

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Successes & Challenges



Successes

- Budget tracking and invoicing
- · Improved grantee compliance with reporting
- Ease of access to grants management information for F5 staff
- · Customized reports
- · Electronic signature
- Elimination of redundant paper-based processes and reduced "version control" issues


Challenges

- Transition from paper-based to electronic system required updating our procedures and documentation
- Citrix
- Compatibility with Mac computers
- Need for training and TA due to staff turnover and infrequent use of the system
- Individual-level client data entry



Ongoing Custom Development

- Ability to automatically calculate allowable indirect costs
- Ability to allow for within-category line-item overspend, up to an F5SMC-approved limit
- Adding additional notes fields to allow for efficient and welldocumented monitoring and review
- Enabling subcontractor budgets to automatically roll up into lead agency budgets, streamlining budgeting and invoicing for F5 and Lead Agencies




Revision Process - primary changes:
