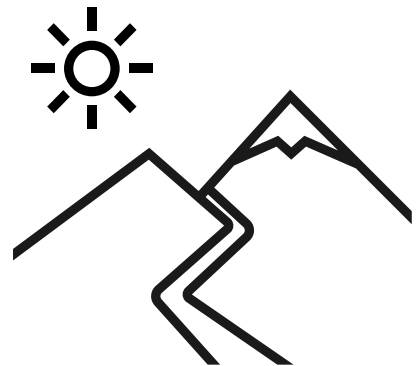

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# Overview of Oral Public Health Program (OPHP)



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## Oral Public Health Program

### California Department of Public Health Office of Oral Health:

- **2014-** Office of Oral Health established in CDPH Center for Healthy Communities
- **2015-** First ever State Dental Director, Dr. Jayanth Kumar hired
- **2018-**
  - Prop 56 funds distributed to form Local Oral Health Programs in 61 Local Health Jurisdictions
  - **SMC Oral Public Health Program** launched

**Collective impact model** for oral public health: collaborate with diverse, cross-sectoral partners to deliver oral public health services

Good oral health means being free of tooth decay, gum disease, oral cancer, and other conditions that affect the mouth and throat. This can be achieved through prevention, education, and community outreach and events. OOH has created a 10-year roadmap to build local level infrastructure, collect statewide data, and deliver consistent and effective oral health messaging.

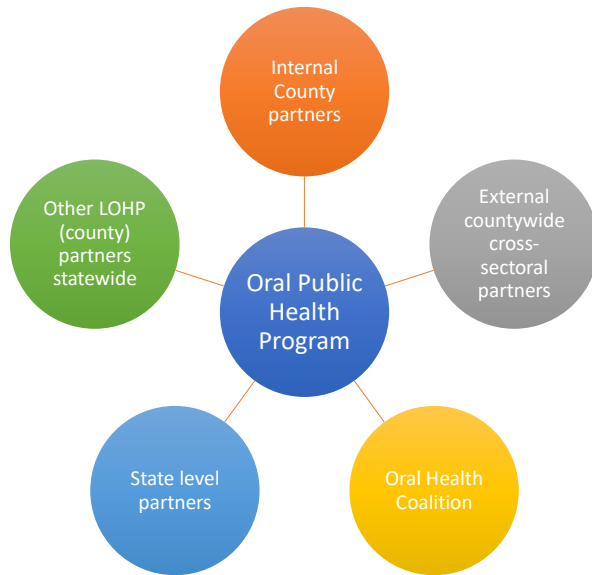

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# School Dental Programs



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## Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment (KOHA)

**What is it?** State mandate passed into law in California 2006:

- All *public school kindergartners and first graders enrolling in public school for their first year* must have an oral health screening completed by a licensed dental professional

**Goals:**

Increase access to dental care for children	Improve oral health outcomes, particularly for historically under-resourced communities	Decrease school absences and improve learning-both affected by poor oral health
Raise awareness of the importance of oral health to overall health – tooth decay is most common chronic childhood disease	Collect data on oral health and use to make data driven decisions

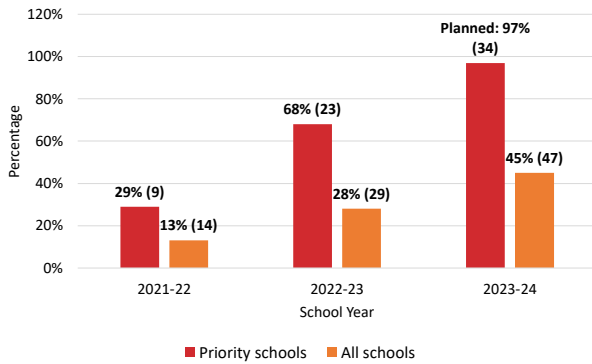


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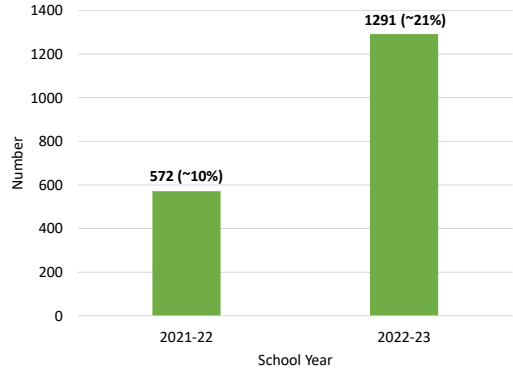
## Increasing on-site KOHA screenings

Number of kindergartners receiving **on-site screenings**, 2021-2023 school years

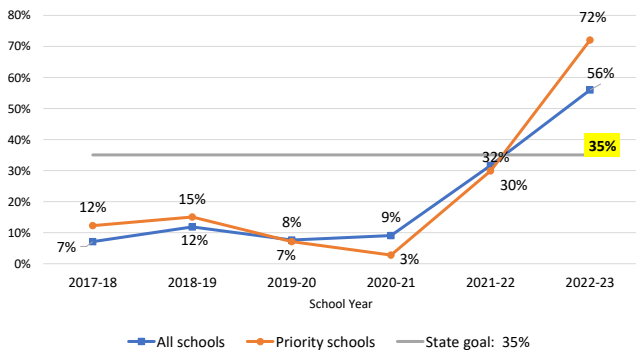


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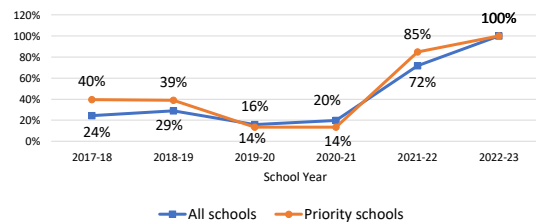
## Increasing KOHA participation and data reporting

- ✓ **Raise awareness** among larger community about KOHA

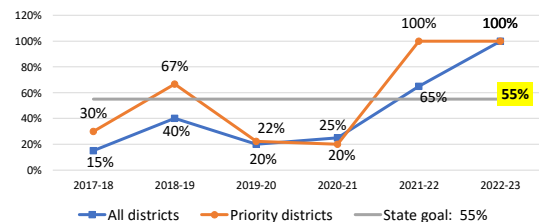
Percentage of **enrolled kindergartners with completed KOHA screening, by school type**



Percentage of schools reporting KOHA data, by school type



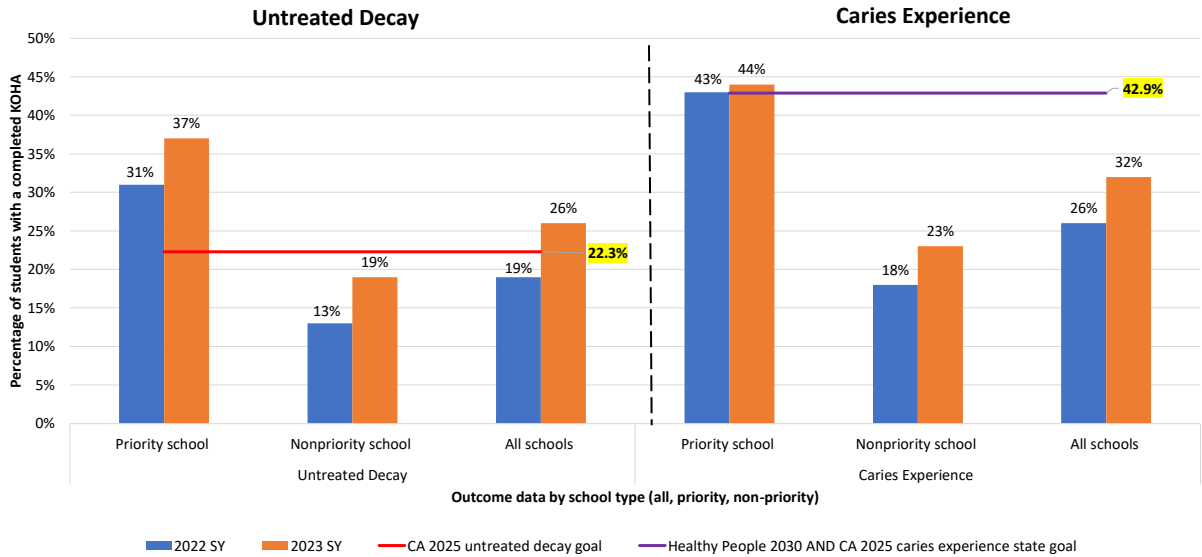
Percentage of districts reporting KOHA data by district type

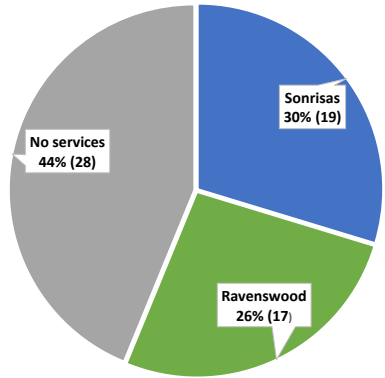
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# Preschool/ early childhood education oral health programs

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# Community oral health messaging and education

## Key Focus Group Themes

1. We want complex information delivered in simple terms
2. First-Time parents/caregivers have different information needs, and information should be customized to address the needs of children of different ages
3. Parents already know the information but they want to know HOW to do it and they want this information delivered in a variety of ways.
4. It is hard to find accurate information and available providers
5. Oral health care practices are different here in the United States compared to where they grew up.

**ORAL HEALTH IS ESSENTIAL TO OUR GENERAL HEALTH AND WELL BEING. IT'S ALL CONNECTED!**  
 Oral health is about MORE than a nice smile

➤ **Healthy mouths, healthy bodies**  
 Babies and children with healthy mouths can eat enough healthy foods and get enough sleep to help their bodies grow and develop well, because they don't have problems chewing, swallowing or sleeping due to an infection in their mouth.

Babies and children with healthy mouths have healthier immune systems, because their bodies don't have to fight off infections from bacteria in their mouth, which can spread to other parts of their body.

**Asthma and oral health**

- Some asthma and acid reflux medicines (about half of children with asthma have acid reflux) and mouth breathing can make the mouth dry. A dry mouth can cause cavities, mouth sores, bad breath, or gum disease. Some asthma medications can cause oral yeast infections (oral thrush).
- Make sure your child rinses their mouth with tap water after using their inhaler. When using an inhaler before bed, rinse or brush teeth immediately afterward.
- Chew sugar-free gum with xylitol to help dry mouth and get rid of the taste of medications if you think your child may have oral thrush; contact their doctor if you are worried your child may have an asthma attack at the dentist, talk to the dentist staff ahead of the visit to discuss ways to make your child more comfortable.

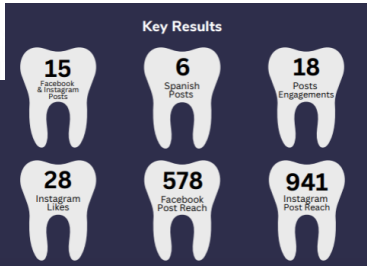

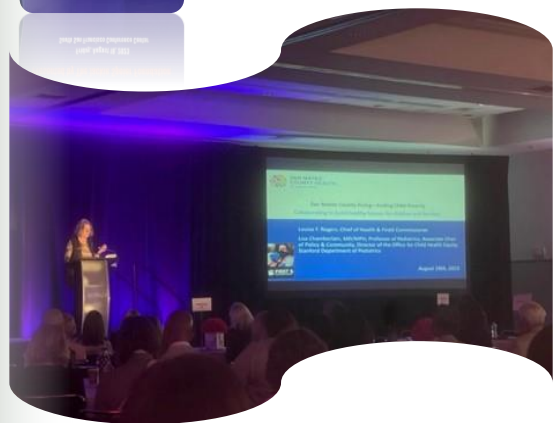

### Cost of Living Standards in SMC

- The SMC self-sufficiency income target (in 2021) for two adults, an infant and a preschooler was \$176,210 or an hourly wage of \$41.72 for each adult.
- This is almost six times the federal poverty level for a family of 4 (which is \$30,000).
- The San Mateo County minimum wage will be \$17.06/hr. starting on Jan 1, 2024, which translates into an annual income of \$35,485 for a full-time minimum wage job.

There are 36,459 children under the age of 5 in San Mateo County, and we estimate that between 2,005 and 3,6465 5.5%-10% live in poverty.



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### Baby Bonus Program

- Provides a cash gift, financial services, aligned & coordinated services and links to benefits enrollment

### Target Population

- Pre-natal women and women with low-income who just gave birth in SMC
- \$300 per month for 2 Years
- 600 newborn babies & their family

### Authentic Partnership with New Parents

## We Envision



- To uniquely advance the evidence on guaranteed income in the United States
- To meet the evidence needs of county officials who will weigh whether to sustain/expand the program after the pilot

*Our aim is to improve the health and well-being of these children and use the findings of the proposed Baby Bonus Program to support policy change*
